On behalf of [organization's name], I am writing in support of Assembly Bill 295 (Jones-Sawyer) which would create a workgroup of higher education students, administration, faculty, and staff to develop a pilot program for free college in California.

After implementing tuition-free college through the Master Plan for Higher Education, the state has since moved in an entirely different direction, as California State University (CSU) tuition and fees have increased by 1360% and University of California (UC) tuition and fees have increased by 555%. Despite increasing investment in the Middle Class Scholarship, many students remain unable to afford the state's public universities' full cost of attendance. As higher education becomes less affordable, access for historically marginalized communities further diminishes.
